



2009/10 EDEN MILLS HOUSEHOLD CARBON FOOTPRINT SURVEY!

Special preview brought to you by your neighbours and friends in the first two weeks of December...



Eden Mills is "Going Carbon Neutral" – but how do we know if we're clomping or tiptoeing on the earth?? By measuring, of course!

This year your neighbours are here to help you! They will be contacting you over THE FIRST TWO WEEKS OF DECEMBER to bring you a handy guide to the survey and to be your personal contact during the survey.

The survey itself is to be completed in the third week of January, so there is no panic - We're making the survey even easier to complete, and even more comprehensive. The volunteers will provide you with the details.

In late January or early February we're going to celebrate the survey returns with a party at the hall: -- prizes, surprises and potluck! (Watch for details! If you would like to help, please contact us at the sender's address above.)

Already our actions are making a difference. In its first year the Village footprint decreased by 7.3%.
